LABGS 2006

The Los Angeles Basin Geological Society is an organization of geoscientists that spreads geologic information to the un-informed and encourages professional growth among its members. Founded in 1967, the LABGS' well being has fluctuated with the same ups and downs as like eustatic sea level charts over the years. Given that our early society history was largely lost, we would like to highlight the current activities and philosophies of the LABGS.

Our goals include:

1. To provide an environment for networking and connecting with fellow geoscientists working in the LA Basin. This is carried out in the form of our luncheon meetings, field trips and our monthly newsletter.

2. To encourage student involvement in the society from the local colleges and universities. This is done through financial support to attend our monthly luncheons, and scholarships. This spring we awarded one of our two annual scholarships, which will be awarded each spring (see additional info in newsletter).

3. To encourage K-12 teacher support via program funding and the PSAAPG Teacher of the Year Award program.

4. To provide technical presentations for professional growth on topics relevant to the geoscientist working in the LA Basin and the world. We currently hold our monthly meetings the fourth Thursday of the month. Except in December, June, July and August where we conduct no meetings. During November we meet on the third Thursday of the month. Since our active membership lives in a geographic area that spans over 4700 square miles, it is a challenge to hold meetings that everyone can attend. Holding the meetings in Long Beach maximizes our exposure for the majority of our members. Our executive board several years ago made the decision to terminate LABGS annual dues. Instead, we now require our members to join the Pacific Section AAPG and keep that membership active with an affiliation to the LABGS. This philosophy is not new or unique since several other societies follow this membership procedure. For the LABGS, this was an intentional move to provide better value by getting two memberships for the price of one.

The Pacific Section AAPG and LABGS operate on a fiscal year from July 1 to June 30. If you are a current member, you will receive a PSAAPG membership renewal notice this month in the mail. Please note, when you renew you are renewing for both LABGS and PSAAPG (for one low price of \$12).

If you haven't done so, take this opportunity to send in a check and update your mailing information. the directory is one of the key benefits of joining the LABGS through PSAAPG. If you are not a member, a membership form is attached to the last page of the newsletter.

As the 2006-year moves into the fall the LABGS finds itself preparing for another year of luncheon meetings. Our current board will continue on for a second year of service in the same officer roles. Elections for new officers are being conducted now and will again be conducted next spring after the National Meeting (2007). Start thinking now about becoming a board member / officer in 2007. It's a great opportunity to make us a stronger organization by bringing new ideas and enthusiasm to the things we do.

The LABGS Brunton Award

The LABGS Brunton Award is given to a qualified undergraduate student attending a four-year LA Basin College or University currently pursuing a baccalaureate degree in Geology or the Earth Sciences. The above award winner was selected from candidates nominated by a faculty member. The winner was selected based on the following criteria:

- Grade point average in earth science classes.
- An enthusiastic or special recommendation from the college advisor, department chair, or mentor professor

The Don Clarke Award

The Don Clarke Brunton Award is given to a qualified student graduating from an LA Basin Community College with an Associate Degree, enrolled in a Geology or Earth Science curriculum with plans to pursue a baccalaureate degree in Geology or the Earth Sciences.

The Society is currently looking for qualified applicants for the 2007 award.

To qualify for this LABGS award, the student must meet the following criteria:

- Plan to graduate in 2006 with an Associate Degree from a Los Angeles Basin Area Community College.
- Complete a Geology or Earth Science curriculum.
- Must be pursuing plans to enroll in a fouryear college or university with Geology, Geological Sciences, or Earth Science as their designated major.
