# "Understanding Downhole Geology: Borehole Image Logs Vs. The Ground Truth"

### **Speaker Abstract**

As reserves become more difficult to find and produce, E & P companies need to have a deeper understanding of the reservoir. The image technology of today allows geologists to see geologic features on the scale of a fraction of an inch. How these images compare to the ground truth of whole core and outcrop analogs is the key to understanding downhole geology. With the ability to see such detail over thousands of feet in the wellbore, we can complete a more accurate sand count in thin beds, we can determine flow direction in crossbeds, and we can see seals that would normally be too thin to see on conventional logs and seismic. These can all be used, not just for geologic interpretation, but reservoir management and planning.

### **Speaker Biography**

Dan Pignatiello is a Senior Log Analyst and Geologist with Halliburton Energy Services. He received his B.S. degree in Geology from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (UNCC). He began his career as a geoscientist with Anadarko Petroleum Corporation where he worked a variety of fields from the deepwater Gulf of Mexico to Enhanced Oil Recovery (EOR) projects in Wyoming and throughout the U.S. Dan now works for Halliburton in Bakersfield, CA, specializing in the geological interpretation of borehole images throughout California.


