January 27th (Thursday) Dr. Donald L. Gautier, Energy Resources Program of the United States Geological Survey will speak on:

U.S. Geological Survey Assessment of Potential Reserves Growth in L.A Basin

Abstract

Reserve growth, the net increase in estimated recoverable resources of an oil or gas field or group of fields through time, has been the most important source of additions to conventional oil reserves in the United States and worldwide for decades. In spite of intense development, reserve growth may be possible wherever in-place resource volumes are large, recovery efficiencies are relatively low, and operators are willing to invest money and technology. For example, in the Los Angeles Basin, one of the world's great petroleum provinces, average field-level recovery efficiencies are typically around 30%. Although petroleum production has been eclipsed somewhat by urbanization in southern California, billions of barrels of recoverable oil may remain to be developed. The U.S. Geological Survey is attempting to quantify the potential for additions to reserves in existing oil and gas fields by means of a probabilistic historical and geologically based assessment methodology.

Speaker's Biography

Dr. Donald L. Gautier is a geologist with the Energy Resources Program of the United States Geological Survey. Born in Los Angeles, he holds a Ph.D. in geology from the University of Colorado and worked for Mobil Oil Corporation before joining the USGS in 1977. He is the author of more than 200 publications, many of which concern geological evaluation of oil and gas resources. Gautier leads the USGS World Petroleum Project and was the principal investigator for the recently-completed USGS Circum-Arctic Resource Appraisal. He lives in Palo Alto, California.


